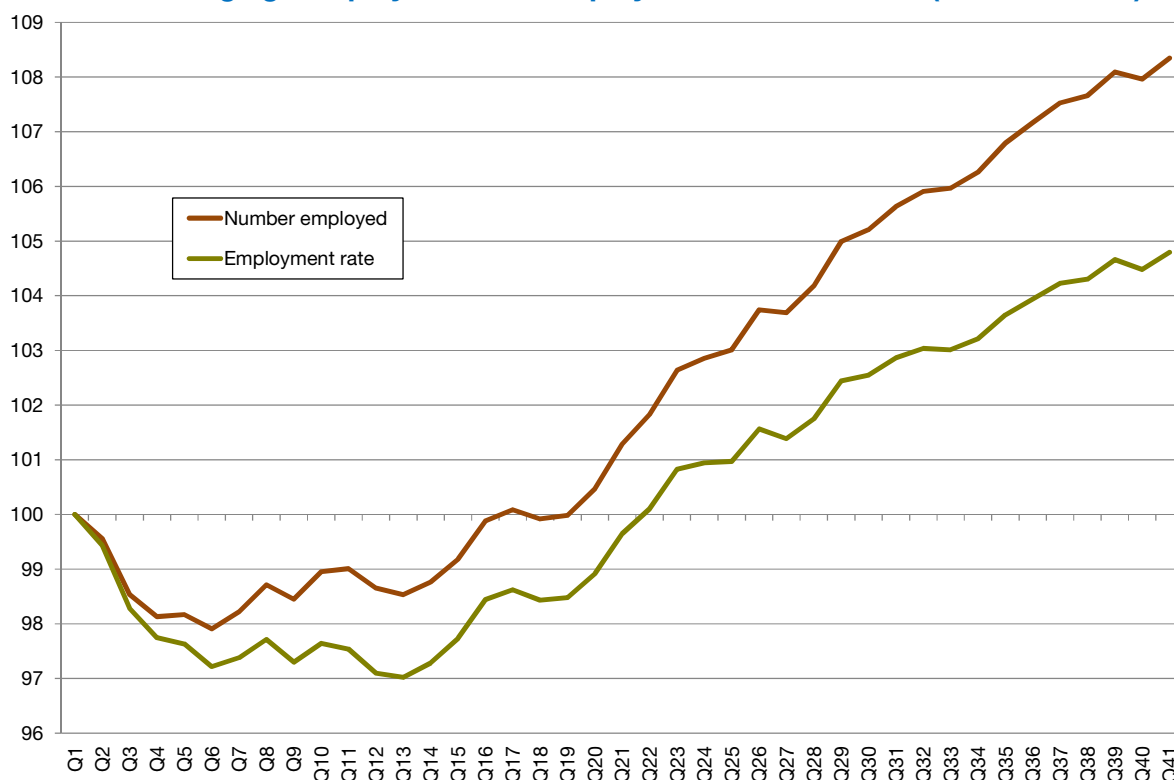

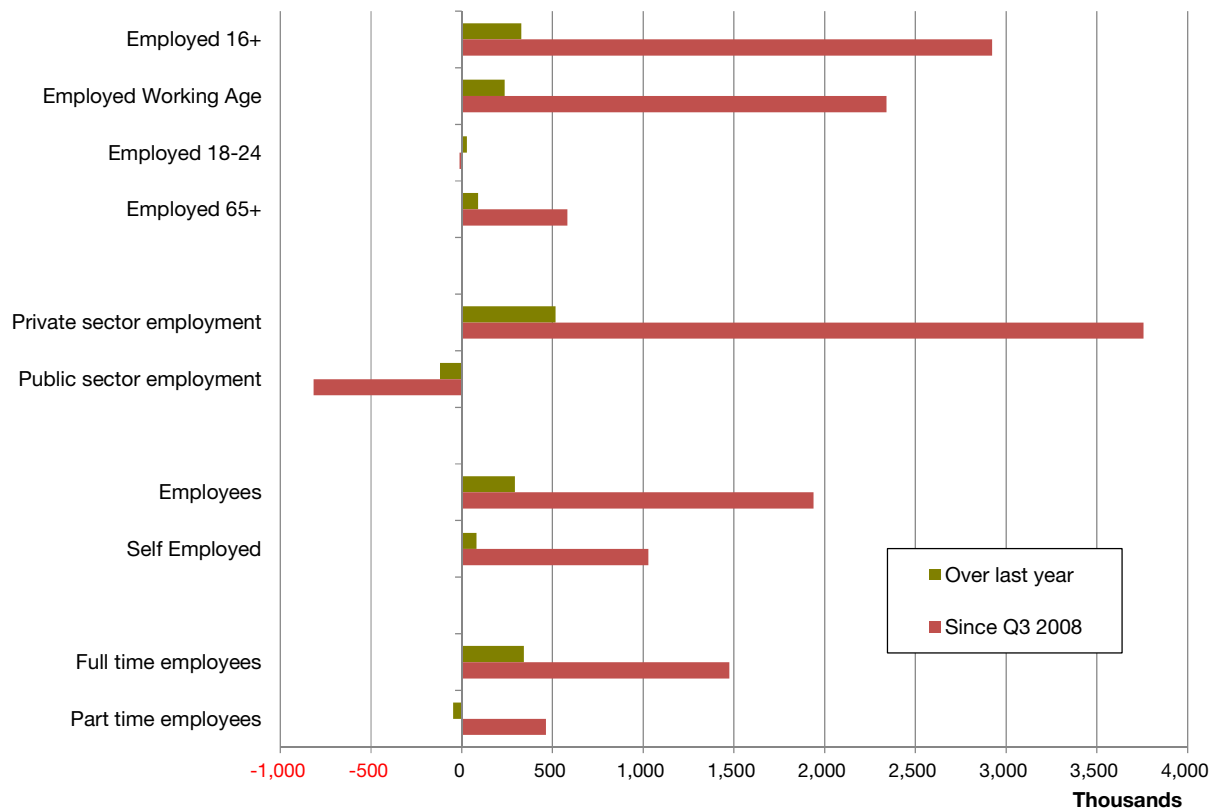

Chart 1: Working age employment and employment rate over time (Q3 2008 = 100)



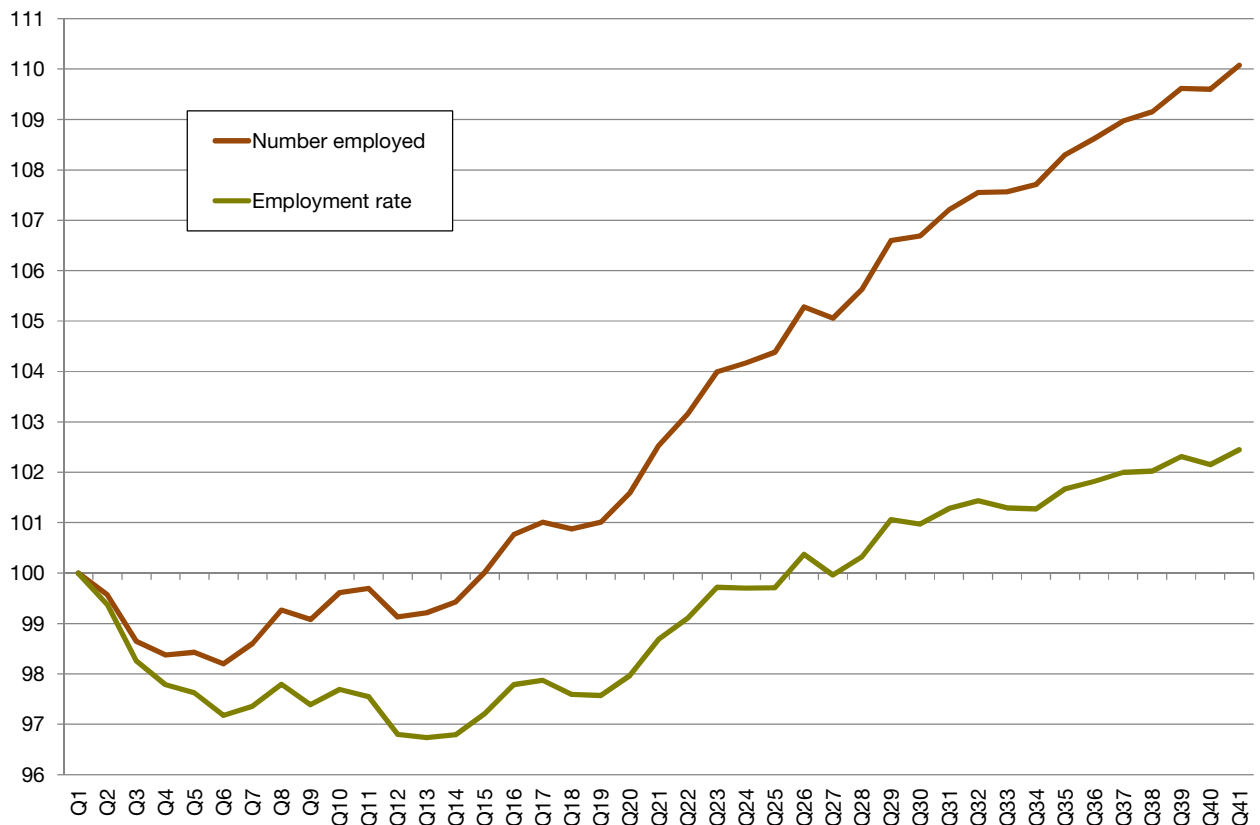
